History in the making

During the coming months the society is creating its own little slice of local history.

On Saturday, February 5 we will celebrate our final meeting in the Athenaeum Theatre which came to our aid when we had no where to hold our meetings and they didn't charge us.

When we take over the court house on February 12, we will also be moving all our archive and equipment from the Lilydale Library. Again the library and staff have been enormously supportive and willingly gave us space in the library so we could continue to offer a research service to the community.

Inaugural meeting

Our inaugural meeting in our new home will be held on Saturday, March 5 just 6 days before our 40th birthday.

The first meeting of the society was held at the Lilydale Shire offices (now the museum) on March 11, 1971.

The meeting will begin at 1pm and at 2pm we will welcome our guest speaker, [Victorian Railways historian and author Michael Foley](#).

Mr Foley is passionate about the former Warburton railway. He will present a photographic journey along the line from Lilydale to Warburton with many contemporary shots blended with rare historical images and documents; the building of the railway and special events and significant incidents in the line's history.

History in the making (cont'd)

Afterwards everyone is welcome to join us for afternoon tea. The cost is free to members and \$2 for non-members.

The first meeting that led to the formation of the society was held at the Lillydale Shire offices (now the museum) on March 11, 1971.

Just for the record, it's worth publishing the information from the first Minute Book:

The people present at that meeting were:

Cr. M. Seymour, Cr. A. Smith, Cr. A. Chandler, Messrs. H. McCoombe, K. Marriott, M. Holt, R. Holt, G. Woodside, L. Blackburn, A. Ross, H. Sebire, K. Hawkey, H. Brown, Ms. A. Woodside, B. Sebire, N. Gordon, APOLOGIES - Cr G. de Pury, Cr J. Sawyer, Mr T. Mitchell, Mrs V. Walker.

Purpose - To form a Historical Society; To collect and collate historical information and records.

The Shire Council, as a continuing body would provide archive storage. INITIAL FOCUS (suggested by H. McCoombe - Royal Historical Society) Research and record history of early settlers and citizens and investigate the records of the formation of early churches and schools.

Moved by L. Blackburn, seconded by H. Brown that the Society be formed within the Shire of Lillydale. - Carried.

COMMITTEE - Messrs. Blackburn, Brown, Hawkey and Ross. TREASURER - Mr Hawkey; SECRETARY - Mr Brown; PRESIDENT - Mr Blackburn to act pro-tem for 3 months. SUBSCRIPTION - \$1.00

Leigh Blackburn remained the society's president until 1990 and Sandy Ross is still on the committee and has been our president since 2001.

It was a day to remember

Lilydale Court House history

The story behind the building

The Department of Public Works called for tenders for the erection of the court house, Lillydale on February 12, 1876. (Note the spelling of Lillydale.)

Interested people could see the specifications and drawings at the Department of Public Works or the police station, Lillydale.

Tenders closed at noon on Thursday, February 24, 1876.

A preliminary deposit of 25 pounds (\$50) was required with the tender.

The Victorian Gazette recorded the successful tender was by William Blyth and the amount was 961 pounds (\$1922).

It seems there may have been a problem or two at the site as in August an advertisement was run seeking a good carpenter to work on the court house, Lillydale.

The town's first substantial building would have attracted more than a little attention as the townsfolk and visitors watched its erection.

One savvy real estate agent thought location was everything and included the court house in his sales adverts in October 1876: "A choice freehold of two acres of land near the Court-house, Lillydale."

Lilydale's design was similar to about nine other court houses built in the 1870s. The design has been attributed to Samuel White and Walter Nation of the Victorian Public Works Department.

The court houses included Oakleigh (built 1870), Ballan (1872), Koroit (1872), Huntly (1873-74), Lexton (1873-4), Wahgunyah (1873-4), Steiglitz (1874), Lilydale (1876) and Avenel (1875-6).

The back room was added in 1967.

The court house was added to the National Trust of Victoria's register in 1970.

The citation said: "A well founded substantial brick courthouse building, prominent carbels, pediment gable and round window heads, recalling the work of Paxton and in the idiom of the Villa Rustica. (24/4/70).

In 1978 the building was considered so important it was

added to the National Estate Register of the Australian Heritage Commission.

The citation says it all:

"Courthouse, Castella Street, Lilydale, is an important example of both the work of the Public Works department (PWD) and of this form of Courthouse. It forms an important part of the townscape of Lilydale, has historical association with the settlement and growth of both town and district and is architecturally important as a notable example of Italianate Classical revival design."

The court house served the community for more than 121 years before the court was closed in 1997. In that time, leading citizens, farmers, businessmen, councillors and shire presidents served as Justices of the Peace and handed down their decisions on the cases before them. With the court now sitting in Ringwood, the building lay idle until in August 2000, the Justice Department deemed the building surplus to its needs.

In the same year, Lilydale Primary School was given the use of court

house as a music and arts facility. However, two weeks after classes started, there was a fire at the rear and the building rendered unusable.

It sat empty waiting for something to happen.

In February 2005, the shire of Yarra Ranges purchased the building and began working out how it could be used by the community.

It was not until the 2008/09 council budget that \$60,000 was allocated to restore the building.

Plans were developed and tenders called. Tenders closed on April 2, 2008 and the tender awarded to Eastwood Properties Pty Ltd on June 6, 2008. The project cost was \$192,221.

In 2008 the Yarra Ranges Museum staff moved into the building after the museum further down Castella Street was closed for redevelopment. This year, 2011, the Lilydale & District Historical Society will take over the building which will be shared with the U3A.



Guided Coach Tours

The society and local tour operator Yarra Valley Specialty Tours have combined to offer groups the chance to learn about the local places that played an important part in Melba's life.

Tour guides will tell the stories behind places such as

- Cave Hill Quarry, established by Melba's father David Mitchell in the 1870s, led to Melba's lifelong love of the Yarra Valley;
- Coombe Farm Vineyard formerly Coombe Farm was purchased by Melba in 1912;
- Coombe Cottage, often referred to as the home behind the hedge was Melba's country home.
- St Patrick's Church was erected by Melba's father.



- The Athenaeum Theatre was the scene of many triumphant Melba concerts.
- Melba Park was named in Melba's honour.
- Yarra Ranges Regional Museum.
- Lilydale Cemetery is Melba's final resting place.

Tours available weekdays during May include pick up in the metro area, a three-course lunch at York on Lilydale and a tour pamphlet.

Memories of Melba 1861 - 2011

Walk in Melba's Lilydale

Experienced society tour guides will take you for a leisurely Walk in Melba's Lilydale.

- Pause outside the stately Athenaeum building and relive the many Melba triumphs;
- See the stately David Mitchell Gates at the entrance of Melba Park and look at the new Yarra Ranges Regional Museum.
- In Main St wander past the fire bell outside the Lilydale Fire Station. Formerly in a tower in the centre of town it is the bell Melba rang in the middle of the night to tell the residents World War I had ended.
- Next to the fire bell is the site of the former Band Rotunda, the scene of Melba's historic welcome back to Lilydale in 1902.
- Opposite is the Crown Hotel which hosted dinner for Melba on that occasion before her return to Melbourne by train.
- Stroll back to the Court House via Melba Park; St Patrick's Church and St John's Church.
