Multi Media Awards

At the suggestion of Gabby Haynes, Heritage Officer with the Yarra Ranges Regional Museum, the society entered our Gun Alley project in the annual Museums Australia Multimedia and Publication Design Awards 2014.

We have been short listed for the Multimedia Award also with several of the nation's leading institutions: Museum of Brisbane; Maitland Regional Art Gallery; National Museum of Australia and Queensland Art Gallery | Gallery of Modern Art.

We are the only historical society listed and also the only Victorian entrant in the Multimedia category.

The awards will be presented as part of the Museums Australia National Conference on Saturday, May 17 at the Tramsheds Function Centre, Launceston, Tasmania, from 5.30pm.

As the society will not be present, we have asked Megan Sheehy from the Yarra Ranges Regional Museum to represented us at the function.

In our eyes, we are already winners and the recognition shows what can be achieved with our member's knowledge and contacts when they are linked with experts and the project receives adequate funding.

Forming partnerships with developers

Many people in heritage organisations have had bad experiences with developers wanting to demolish homes and buildings.

At Lilydale, we have had great success working with developers on two significant homes in the township. In each case, they appreciated the value of the property and wanted to know more to enhance their property's future.

The Manor House

For many months the society has been quietly working with the owners of the Manor House on Maroondah Highway near the Warburton Trail.

There has been some misinformation circulating about

After some discussion the former slate roof has been replaced with iron so the interior is now protected and work on the interior can start.

While a slate roof would have been ideal, that used on the roof was from Wales and used as ballast from ships so was not a good quality and couldn't be sourced as the quarry is closed.

Eva and Jeff have also had the many layers of exterior paint from the building to reveal the original handmade bricks. One layer included a pink colour.

The society's research has supported the couple in their restoration plans and is a great example of developers, historical societies and councils working closely together.

the property. It's time to set the record straight. Initially, the society worked closely with shire of Yarra Ranges staff to stop the former owner getting a demolition order from the Building Appeals Board. On September 25, 2012, the board dismissed the owners application to demolish the home based largely on the society's report on the property and information supplied by the shire's own heritage advisor.

The owner quickly sold the property to a developer who then sold the portion containing the Manor House and a block fronting Warburton Highway to the current owners

This couple live in Sunshine and fell in love with the place which was in a shocking state.

They have spent weekend after weekend working on the home and getting council approval for their plans to restore it to its former glory.

They came to the Court House during their first weekend as owners and we provided them with all the information and images we could find. In return, they have been providing us with lots of photos of the interior and exterior and various changes as work is done. These images have been donated to our collection.

Deschamp

Earlier last year another developer walked through the court house doors and contracted us to research the history and source any photos we could find on the Deschamp's property in Pine Street. It was amazing how many scenes of Lilydale included the home in the background. He was rapt with our work and the images we produced. He has now retained the home on site and the shire has allowed development of the other part of the large site.

Coombe Cottage

Society member Sue Thompson has just completed a detailed report on Coombe Cottage for the council to use for the listing of the home on the State Register. Carried out in consultation with the Vestey family, Sue's report traces the owners of the property via the property titles; images throughout the years; descriptions of the home from the time Melba purchased it in 1909 and some of the leading citizens of the country who visited and stayed at Coombe. We were able to draw on our own collection of images gathered by Sandy Ross over the years.

RHSV Seminar

John Brown and Philip Burton attended the RHSV Seminar on Current & Future Challenges in Information Technology and How to build and maintain memberships held in the city in March.

Our own Sue Thompson was one of the speakers and spoke about the Gun Alley project which included showing them how the interactive website worked and the video interview with society member Ruby and her brother on the SP Bookie.

Sue's talk was very well received and congratulations to all those who spend many hours researching the information.

The city seminar is one of four being held in Victoria by the RHSV and The History Support Group.

Sue whose talk was Digitise Your Photographic Collection and reap the Rewards traced the history of our society and its journey along the digital pathway and its financial possibilities. Sue stressed that knowledge, information and images were valuable and societies should not be frightened to charge for them. Without

Activities on the day included tours of the workings of the Park and what services were available. There were representatives from the various Funeral Directors.

Headstone Project Research

It is amazing to research the stories behind the headstones. Currently we are doing a project funded by the Shire of Yarra Ranges based on those people with headstones buried at

Lilydale Cemetery between 1861 and 1931.

Already members are learning a lot about life, and at times, the sad past, of the Lilydale district.

Through the headstones project our volunteers are learning about the outbreak of disease such as typhoid and scarlet fever; the high infant mortality rate and death through drowning, farm accidents and murder.

If one of your ancestors is buried at the cemetery between the project dates and has a headstone, we would love to hear from you so we can include your family history on our website.

To check the names or to help with the project, call Lorraine on 9735 1104 or pop in and see her between 1pm and 4pm on a Fridays at the Court House and she will run you through the project.

The images of the headstones and the family information will be added to our website.
