New home for Deschamp painting

Following the death of his second wife, the executors of John (Jack) Deschamp contacted the society and asked if we would be interested in a painting of the old Deschamp's wine hall that stood on the north-west corner of Cave Hill Road and Albert Hill Road.

Jack's widow had expressed the desire to have the painting housed in Lilydale as that was where the Deschamp's family settled and lived for three generations.

Jack Deschamp was the great grandson of Victor Joseph Clement Deschamp (known as Joseph Clement) who arrived in Melbourne in 1854 and settled in Lilydale in 1860.

Jack's grandfather (Victor's son) was Jean Louis (known as Louis) who established the Olinda Vineyard in the 1860s and built the Olinda Wine Hall and his home in 1878.

The vineyard and wine hall was taken over by the next generation, John's father Louis John, a viticulturist and later a farmer and horse trainer, took over the Olinda Vineyard and wine hall from his father.

Louis John married Anne Slevin at Lilydale in 1904 and John, their third son was born in 1909. He married Phyllis and they had one child Peter born in 1952 but died aged 5 in 1957. Unlike previous generations, Jack left Lilydale and worked in the automotive parts industry for 53 years. He worked for A.G. Healing Ltd and became Box Hill branch manager and later manager of the company's new

branch at Dandenong which supplied automotive parts and accessories for GMH Nasco group. He remained with the group until it went into receivership in 1969 when he set up his own auto parts business in Carnegie called Jaydee Auto Parts which he operated until 1977. John died on May 9, 1989.

The artist Christine Deschamp was John's niece and was born in 1939, the daughter of Joseph and Ennis Deschamps. The painting was completed in 1987 and was based on a 1906 photo of the wine hall. The large painting now proudly hangs in the society's office.

Note: The family name was Deschamp but various members added an 's' to their names and became Deschamps.

Lilydale Express Now on Trove

Thanks to the generosity of the Executor of Jim Sawyer's Estate, the society's plan of financing the digitisation of the Lilydale Express by the National Library of Australia is now a step closer. The society set aside \$5,000 of Jim's bequest to start digitising the Express. To date the years 1886 to 1888 are now up on Trove and are fully searchable. We expect the funds will complete all the editions up to 1895.

The National Library estimates it will cost about \$35,000 to do all the newspapers up to 1954, so it will be some time before we reach that goal.

Each year we will look at allocating some funds towards this project. If you would like to help with the project a donation of \$500 will enable us to finance two more years. To see a page in Trove go to:

100 years ago

ARBOR DAY AT LILYDALE.

On Saturday last, Arbor Day was celebrated at Lilydale, this being the twenty-third occasion on which the day has been observed, Mr. E. A. Janson having been at the head of the movement since its inception. Another very old worker is Mr. C. Cook, who is noted as always being the first man on the job. No trees were planted this year, the work decided on by the committee being to dig round and prune the trees between Anderson street and Warburton bridge. The workers were not as numerous as they might have been, but what was lacking in quantity was made up in quality, for really good work was done by those present. An old and dangerous tree was removed from opposite Dr. A. E. Syme's residence. The trees along this portion of Main street now bear a neat appearance. Afternoon tea was provided at Mrs. W. J. Wilson's residence by the ladies' committee, and was served to the workers. Mr. and Mrs. Wilson also have been connected with the Arbor Day movement for many years. Proceedings were enlivened by selections rendered during the afternoon by the Lilydale Brass Band.

President's 46th Annual Report 2017 -2018

It has again been a most successful and rewarding year for our society as after many years of planning we are now able to truly provide a valuable and valued service to the community in many forms listed below.

Our collection

The backbone and reason to be, is our collection. It is just not what is in the collection but how it can accessed and utilised by ourselves for the community. We have several elements to our collection: our photographs, Sandy's negative collection; our archive, our objects, library and increasingly our born digital collection. Thanks to our committee, treasurer Philip Burton has developed a series of databases covering all of these collections. Although the cataloguing work is and will be on-going, Philip and secretary Joy Gothe have now set up directories which volunteers can readily access.

If someone walks in wanting information on a family, place or event, those on duty go to the one directory and do a search of the databases to find what we have and where it is located – all in a matter of a couple of minutes. We are now harnessing the full potential of our valuable collections and applying it to the benefit of the community. Also any volunteer can now find it on shelf location of any item.

Cataloguing is an on-going project and our members love it because they are learning more and more about not only our collection but also about the local stories surrounding each item. Also, Judy Macdonald has a team quietly working away at indexing those library books without an index. This means her database of several thousand listings can find every book a name, place or event is mentioned. Very impressive work.

Our activities

Some activities were talks at the court house, many external and we held walks to both the cemetery and around Lilydale. All of these activities are vital as they enable us to promote ourselves and talk with a wide audience outside and within the Shire of Yarra Ranges. A by-product of these activities has been the donation to our collection of several valuable items and images.

Finances

I want to highlight the wonderful \$10,000 donation received from the executor of the Estate of former Life Member Jim Sawyer. This donation has enabled us to replace our 10 filing cabinets with Australian-made heavy-duty cabinets. We also purchased two cameras – one high end camera to photograph our collection objects and the other to use to photograph our society

activities and other events. We also purchased a special table used to photograph our objects. With the remaining \$5000 we have now entered into an agreement with the National Library of Australia to pay for the digitisation of the Lilydale Express from the first edition in 1886 until about 1895. The first of those years are now up on Trove and are fully searchable.

Digital Age

Today, historical societies must fully embrace the digital age to stay in touch with the communities they serve as the community expects instant responses and information at the touch of a button. We ignore them at our peril. At Lilydale we have been fortunate to have the support of the not-for-profit company Paragim4 and Paul Favolic since the mid 1990s. With their support we have expanded our on-line presence with the LDHS website and Nellie Melba Museum. These two websites give us access to not just our community but the national and international communities. Our reach is such that we have attracted offers of donations from the UK, America and Europe throughout the years. Those donations that did not fit our own Collection Policy have been referred to the Yarra Ranges Museum which has snapped them up with glee.

Thank you to John Brown for the work he has done with Paula Favolic during the last 12 months. This is now giving us a strong and valued on-line presence.

Research

Research is a vital part of our society. We are averaging one inquiry per week. Some big, some small and some who want the information for nothing. We are fortunate to have several skilled researchers who ensure we provide timely and accurate information to our clients. Our information is valuable and those seeking information are more than happy to pay for the services we offer.

Some major projects completed this year were Public Places for the Shire of Yarra Ranges; Cave Hill World War II Memorial Gates names and Main Street shop history. In each several members worked tirelessly gathering the necessary information.

Displays and Book Launch

I would like to end with a highlight of the year which was the launch of Val Sheehan's fourth and final *As It Happened* book. Sadly, Val wasn't able to see it launched but made sure all the information was with me so I could finish it for her. The attendance of some many people including her family and granddaughter Eloise from Canada shows how important the book is to the community and to Val Sheehan.
