It has taken society members a hundred or more hours and two years of research, phone calls and interviews but now the Gun Alley project is ready for its debut.

The project which tells the story of a group of homes in John Street, Lilydale, known as Gun Alley.

Each property owner has been traced and recorded; photos found and where possible oral histories and videos made.

With the help of the a Sharing Stories grant from the Australian

Government Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities, Gun Alley features three elements: a display; a 160 plus page book with more than 200 images and a Gun Alley addition to our website.

The society employed the Sydney-based Mental Media to create the program to add all the information. The programming design included the ability for us to add more audio, video, images and text when it comes to light. Visitors to the Gun Alley pages simply click on one of the properties to find the names of the owners, images, audio and video content.

Society secretary Sue Thompson said this was only supposed to be small project and seemed simple at the time.

“But it took on a life of its own as we traced the owners and researched their stories. From just two images on Gun Alley in our society’s collection, we have now added 300 plus, all willingly supplied by descendants of families who lived there.”

Helping to plan the future of Cave Hill

Sue Thompson has been appointed to the Plan Cave Hill Community Reference Group to represent the interests of the community, particularly in the preservation of the historic elements of the site.

The group has met twice and before the second meeting members went on a tour of the site.

Following extensive community consultation earlier this year, the partnership of Sibelco (owners of Cave Hill) and Places Victoria (formerly the Urban Land Authority) have been working on the Masterplan with the Shire of Yarra Ranges and the community.

"Teams of consultants have been working on the whole range of elements of the site including: the heritage of the site; transport, infrastructure, archaeology, environment, recreation etc.

"The results of this work have been incorporated into the draft Masterplan which will be released this month. Also this month, a series of community meetings will be organised to encourage input and comment on the plan from residents.

"This is an exciting and massive project which will provide a huge boost to Lilydale and the wider community," Sue said.

"The draft does not include the heritage elements at this stage as there is a lot of work still to be done on recording the history and assessing the visual and built heritage of the site."
