She was a wonderful committee member, always had a smile and often had a different perspective to us all on life and people in general. Evelyn never missed a meeting, committee meeting or her rostered day.

Single-handed she undertook to write up the worksheets for our 400 plus ANZACS including their name, enlistment number and unit from information given to her. Night after night she worked away and when that was finished she

would go into the Old Lilydale Court House to do research on some of our boys who included her own Goodall family. She was the first to the "barricades" in our disagreement with the shire and while she couldn't hear most of what was happening, she always put in her pennyworth to the discussion.

The family graciously asked me to be a part of the service and I was only too happy to oblige as Evelyn and I shared many happy hours doing duty. Sadly, Evelyn did not live to see the Goodall display proudly hanging in the court house but her daughter Jenny kindly

unveiled the board on behalf of her mum.

Our new storage shed

During the negotiations over our new Licence Agreement the shire agreed to allow us to erect a small additional shed at the court house to store some of large bulky items such as banners, display boards and non-collection materials.

This dream became a reality when in just four weeks during January a small patch of grass behind the court house was transformed into our new shed lovingly dubbed Les' Shed but everyone involved.

Under the guidance of Life Member and builder Les Skate, 10 members donated 412 hours as they laboured under his firm direction to dig the foundations, lay the concrete, erect the walls and roof, put in the insulation and plaster board and finish with the painting team. It was at committee member John Brown's suggestion that Les's Shed now stands proudly with the other sheds (2 former outdoor loos) on the site.. We were fortunate to have member and plumber Trevor Smith take charge of the roof, guttering and drainage. As project manager, Les Skate some how managed to convince people to dig deep and reduce the costs of materials while his son Tim's building business donated a lot of materials.

The shed has been fully insulated and lined and with the generous donation of a fire proof Bookkeepers cabinet by one of our sponsors Lilydale Locksmiths, our shed will soon be doing great service.

We still have to do the fitout which will include metal, adjustable shelving and once that is done, we will be holding an official opening with a special afternoon tea provided by members. Sue Thompson receives an RHSV Award of Merit

On Saturday, November 5, Associate Professor Don Garden presented society president Sue Thompson with a Royal Historical Society of Victoria Award of Merit in recognition of her contribution to the society and local community.

He said Sue had been an active member of the Lilydale & District Historical Society Inc. since 1987.

“She was made a Life Member in 1995 for her outstanding contribution to researching and recording of local history for the old Shire of Lilydale. She is currently our President and previously held that role from 1990 to 2001 and as Secretary from 2009 to 2015. She is an active volunteer at our current home the Old Lilydale Court House, and previously at the Museum of Lilydale. She also served on the Museum of Lilydale Board of Management, and was very active in fund raising for the extensions to what is now the Yarra Ranges Regional Museum,” Assoc Prof Garden said.

“Sue moved to Kilsyth on Australia day in 1972, with her husband Wal, where they raised two boys, Andrew and Stuart, and are now proud grandparents.

“In her professional life she became a journalist in 1976, and became the News Editor of ‘The Express’ in 1983, and regional Editor in 1988 for Leader Newspapers.

“In her spare time she also ran her own publishing company ‘Roundabout Publishing’ and the society has been very fortunate that the combination of these roles have resulted in Sue writing and/or co-ordinating the

publication of the society’s publication of 30 plus books and school kits.

“Sue has published several other history books, including: Ray Henderson’s book ‘From Jolimont to Yering’ and Pamela Lady Vestey’s book and ‘David Mitchell A Forfar Man’.

“Sue was awarded Citizen of the Year for the Shire of Lilydale in 1989 for her work on numerous community committees, and her work in the establishment and development of library services within the municipality.

“Sue was elected Councillor of the Shire of Lilydale in 1990 and served the South Riding Ward until the Shire was dissolved in December 1994 and combined with others to create the Shire of Yarra Ranges.

“Sue’s two main passions after her family are:

- The Lilydale & District Historical Society, where she is the driving force of the Society, especially in the area of embracing technology. An example is our website www.lilydalehistorical.com.au
- Dame Nellie Melba on whom she has done extensive research and created and maintains the website Nellie www.nelliemelbamuseum.com.au and is often asked to speak to groups on the life of Dame Nellie.

Sue said she could have achieved nothing without the support of her family - husband Wally and sons Andrew and Stuart - and the wonderful members of the society.

“This award is not for me but for my family and the society,” Sue said.

A Big Thank You to Our Priceless Volunteers

Our society could not exist without the wonderful work of our volunteers who perform hundreds of hours of work at the court house. They do many things including roster duty, indexing, cataloguing, scanning and research. Each year, to express its thanks, the society holds a volunteers luncheon which this year was on January 17. They Answered the Call ANZACS Launch

Like so many projects at the society, it all started as an idea which just grew and grew, Our aim was to tell the stories of the men and women who fought in World War I and came from the towns listed in our Collecting Policy.

Little did we know how many it would be as we uncovered people not listed on the local honour boards or memorials.

They Answered the Call which received funding from the Federal Government's ANZAC Centenary Fund became a project which involved many of our members in many, many hours of research of more than 400 local people and their families. The driving force and co-ordinator for the project was Jeanette Dodson who kept meticulous records of who was doing what and made sure all were finished on time.

Drawing on our experience with our Stories Behind the Headstones project, special worksheets were drawn up for each person and this meant we achieved great consistency in information, particularly from the service records and researchers were able to quickly access all of our resources.

By our launch of the project on November 26, 2016, every one of the soldiers are now up on our website and already people have contacted us wanting to add to the family story or conversely use the information for their own research.
